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Demographic Profile

The population in Matagorda County, Texas was 36,743 per American Community Survey data for 2014-2018.

The region has a civilian labor force of 16,890 with a participation rate of 59.4%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Matagorda County, Texas, 15.8% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 32.9% in the nation.

The median household income in Matagorda County, Texas is \$45,500 and the median house value is \$107,500.



Employment Trends


As of 2020Q1, total employment for Matagorda County, Texas was 12,409 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2020Q1, employment declined 0.6% in the region.



Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2020Q1.

Unemployment Rate

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Matagorda County, Texas was 12.5% as of July 2020. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 12.2%. One year earlier, in July 2019, the unemployment rate in Matagorda County, Texas was 5.5%.



Wage Trends

The average worker in Matagorda County, Texas earned annual wages of \$52,602 as of 2020Q1. Average annual wages per worker decreased 0.9% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$57,624 in the nation as of 2020Q1.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2020Q1.



Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 12.6% lower in Matagorda County, Texas than the U.S. average.



Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in Matagorda County, Texas is Health Care and Social Assistance, employing 1,452 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Educational Services (1,406 workers) and Retail Trade (1,365). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Utilities (LQ = 20.89), Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting (5.45), and Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (4.61).

Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2019Q3 with preliminary estimates updated to 2020Q1.

Sectors in Matagorda County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$143,020), Utilities (\$127,579), and Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction (\$103,859). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (+338 jobs), Manufacturing (+140), and Construction (+109).

Over the next 1 year, employment in Matagorda County, Texas is projected to contract by 23 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +0.8% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Health Care and Social Assistance (+12 jobs), Accommodation and Food Services (+5), and Construction (+4).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Matagorda County, Texas is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 1,227 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Management Occupations (1,127 workers) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1,081). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations (LQ = 3.30), Architecture and Engineering Occupations (2.10), and Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations (1.79).

Occupation groups in Matagorda County, Texas with the highest average wages per worker are Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$92,800), Management Occupations (\$89,100), and Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations (\$78,200). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.8% among Legal Occupations to 11.8% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Matagorda County, Texas is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.4% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+6 jobs) and Healthcare Support Occupations (+6). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (189 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (149).



Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and currently updated through 2019Q3, imputed where necessary with preliminary estimates updated to 2020Q1. Wages by occupation are as of 2019 provided by the BLS and imputed where necessary. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.



Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Matagorda County, Texas with the highest relative concentration is Coal/Oil/Power with a location quotient of 14.91. This cluster employs 1,626 workers in the region with an average wage of \$124,333. Employment in the Coal/Oil/Power cluster is projected to contract in the region about 1.2% per year over the next ten years.



Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Matagorda County, Texas is projected to contract 0.2% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.3% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to contract 0.2% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to contract 0.0% per year.


Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2019, nominal GDP in Matagorda County, Texas contracted 0.5%. This follows growth of 9.4% in 2018. As of 2019, total GDP in Matagorda County, Texas was \$1,922,236,000.

Of the sectors in Matagorda County, Texas, Utilities contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2019, \$821,089,000 The next-largest contributions came from Manufacturing (\$232,836,000); Educational Services (\$90,558,000); and Health Care and Social Assistance (\$89,802,000).

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
